he Assamese people in Bhutan are mainly Muslim and speak Bengali. They are generally less orthodox than most Asian Muslims and are involved in many Hindu festivals and customs. They live in Bhutan, a Buddhist country. Most depend on agriculture for a living.

Ministry Obstacles

Though access is improving for ministry among the Assamese, it is still very limited. Bhutan is one of the hardest countries to access because of the geography and the local culture.

Outreach Ideas

Spreading God's word through the few believers that already exist in Bhutan could help more Assamese people come to believe.

Pray for those who follow Jesus to live lives filled with grace and kindness. Pray for them to be leaders and to set an example of what knowing Jesus looks like in practical ways. Pray the Assamese people find ways to let the peace of Christ rule in
