Bayad in Mongolia



n the 13th century, the term
"Mongol" grew into an umbrella
term for a large group of tribes
united under the rule of Genghis
Khan. Ethnic distinctions among the
Mongol subgroups are relatively
minor. Tribal differences are usually
not a political or social issue as
Mongolia is a generally peaceful
nation. The Bayad people are one of
the Mongol tribes, residing in
western Mongolia.

Obstacles

Mongolia is a very large country with limited travel facilities. Access to remote tribes requires effort. Almost half of the Bayad people are Buddhists. The form of Buddhism in Mongolia is the Tibetan form that is mixed with shamanism and spirit appeasement. It is difficult for them to understand faith in the living Christ.

Outreach Ideas

There are Bible resources in their Halh Mongolian language. The entire Bible, audio and visual resources, including the JESUS Film can be used by those willing to pay the price to reach Bayad people in Mongolia with the gospel.
