

Hakka Chinese in China, Hong Kong



While the Hakka have cultural differences from Han Chinese, they are still considered Chinese. The Hakka people are most numerous in Taiwan and southern China's Guangdong Province, but many also live in Malaysia and Hong Kong. They have their own cuisine, architecture and dress. Their spiritual beliefs are very similar to other Han Chinese groups. At one time there were Hakka villages in Hong Kong, but that part of the world is becoming increasingly urban.

Ministry Obstacles

The Hakka people are not as open to the claims of Christ as most of their neighbors.

Outreach Ideas

The JESUS Film is available in their dialect. There is a complete Bible for them and online "talking" Bibles are available to the Hakka people. A sizable number of Hakka believers live in Malaysia. In Hong Kong and nearby Guangdong Province, there are many followers of Christ who can reach out to the Hakka population.
