



Hu in China

The Hu are a distinct ethnolinguistic people group listed by the Chinese government as an undetermined minority. They live simple lives, tending to rice paddies built into mountain slopes. Once oppressed by Chinese landowners, the land redistribution programs of the 1950s ended their oppression.

Ministry Obstacles

Although the Hu claim to be Buddhists, their daily lives are more influenced by animistic beliefs. They fear demons and believe that all sickness and bad luck come upon them because of upsetting the delicate balance between the natural and spiritual worlds.

Outreach Ideas

Only the blood of Christ can prevail over the demonic forces that rule the land and the Hu people. Pray for the Holy Spirit to move the hearts of Christian believers to seek and reach them with the truth of the gospel so that the risen Christ will be manifested.

Prayer Focus

Two hundred years of mission work in China was not able to reach the
