

Kabyle Berbers in Belgium



The Kabyle are a North African Berber tribe. The Africans call this entire region of North Africa Maghrib. During the third century, the Romans named the people of the Maghrib "Berber," which means "barbarian." Some arrived in Belgium after World War II when there was a labor shortage. Others went as merchants since Belgium was an important trading partner with North African countries.

Ministry Obstacles

The Muslim Kabyle Berbers rarely meet people in Belgium who follow Jesus Christ with all their hearts.

Outreach Ideas

Many Kabyle are searching for answers beyond Muslim fundamentalism. Those in North Africa do not have the freedom to follow Christianity, but those in Belgium do. Although a number of them have responded to recent Christian programs produced in France, there are still many who remain unreached.
