Wandala in Cameroon



The Mandara Kingdom was a West African kingdom in the Mandara mountains of what is today Cameroon. This kingdom was established about the year 1500, according to tradition. The Wandala (AKA, Mandara) people are descended from the kingdom's inhabitants. Muslim visitors converted one of the kings to Islam in the 18th century, and the Islamification of the kingdom continued for most of the next century. Today, the Wandara live in compact villages that are grouped in rectangular compounds. Each compound, which contains several small huts, is surrounded by a dirt wall. They are almost entirely Muslim.

Ministry Obstacles


Nominal Christianity is a huge problem in Cameroon, so Muslims do not see living Christianity in action.
