Mongallese Arab in South Sudan



The Arabization of the Middle East and North Africa began in the seventh and eleventh centuries, which caused the displacement of many tribes and pre-Islamic nomadic groups. These invasions overran and absorbed the weaker black African farmers who lived in and around oases and trading centers. The Mongallese were one of these groups. They are Black African and Arab. They speak Creole Arabic, a somewhat different form. They live in South Sudan.

Ministry Obstacles

One obstacle is the distinct dialect of the Mongallese Arabs. Another obstacle is their devotion to Mohammed and Islam. They see him as the "seal of the prophets" and Jesus as a prophet second to Mohammed and the Bible as "corrupted." The constant fighting in South Sudan prevents Christian witness.

Outreach Ideas

Radio and television evangelism are relatively private. So, too, are medical missions. A Mongallese Arabic Bible is needed. The church in South Sudan needs to witness with boldness and grace.
