Arabized Shaikia in Sudan



The Shaikia claim descent from Shayig Ibn Humaidan, who came from Arabia at the time of the conquest of Egypt in the 7th century. The Shaikia consist of twelve subtribes, each descended from one of the twelve sons of the founder, Shaig. Most children attend government schools. Women teach while men farm, and children attend religious schools called Khalawi, where they learn and memorize the Koran before attending government school. The Shaikia tribe speaks and writes its own Arabic dialect.

Ministry Obstacles

Muslims in Sudan do not welcome Christian workers, so evangelists need creative access approaches.

Outreach Ideas

Perhaps the Shaikia tribe will discover the availability of scripture downloads in their language to phones and computers.

Prayer Focus

Pray for the few individuals within the Shaikia tribe who identify themselves as Christians, that they will live holy lives and consistently demonstrate the fruit of God's Spirit.
