



Iberogen in Niger

Formerly livestock herders, some Igalden have changed to trading and gardening as alternative sources of income. As trade plays a larger role in their lives, the men have become increasingly bilingual in Hausa and Tamajaq, two essential trade languages. Their own language is called Tagdal.

Ministry Obstacles

Resistance to religious change is high. The Igalden are almost 100% Muslim and it is difficult for new religious ideas to make headway.

Outreach Ideas

The Igalden are often more open to efforts to meet their needs rather than what they see as useless. Any outreach should keep this in mind. They will need to hear any new message in their heart language, Tagdal.

Pray for the Church

Currently there is no church among this people group, so pray that one will soon take root. Pray that the Igalden have more access to schools and medical clinics. Pray that there is
