Ministry obstacles

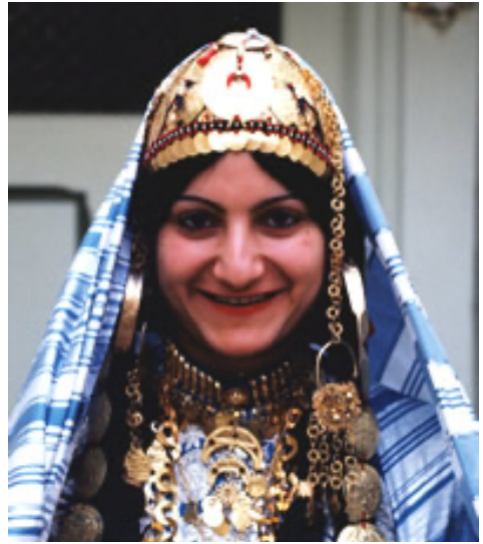
Historic antisemitism on the part of Christians is the major obstacle to winning a hearing among Tunisian Jews. Jews usually see Christian evangelization as anti-Semitism. Language is also a problem because Tunisian Arabic is not standard Arabic.

Outreach Ideas

Befriending Tunisian Jews by immigrant Israeli Jewish believers in Jesus may lead to opportunities for personal evangelism. Evangelistic radio and television broadcasts in Tunisian Arabic may help reach them.

Prayer Focus

Pray for Israeli churches to adopt Tunisian Jews and foster Tunisian Jewish-Christian congregations. Pray that the Holy Spirit will prepare these Jews to open the eyes of their hearts
