Uighurs in Istanbul, Turkey



The Uighurs are a Turkic-speaking people who converted to Islam in the 10th century, and they primarily live in Xinjiang Province, China. Recently more than a million Uighurs have been detained in Chinese internment camps, where they are being indoctrinated in the ways of communism, speak Mandarin, and denounce their culture including Islam. Many have sought refuge in other countries, and several thousand of them are presently living in Istanbul.

Ministry Obstacles

The oppressive treatment of their people has caused the development of several militant Uighur groups in Turkey that want Xinjiang Province to separate from China. Since they use Islam as their banner, they are more resistant to any Christian witness. The Turkish people often don't accept the Uighurs as they see them as troublemakers. This compounds the Uighurs' distrust of those outside their community, including those who want to take Christ to them.

Outreach Ideas

Places like Australia, U.S., and Canada have accepted Uighur immigrants from China and Turkey, and they are allowed to maintain their cultural traditions. This gives believers an opportunity to show interest in their lives, which can open the
