Baori in India



he Baori are described as a nomadic group who were once associated with criminal activities. This community has three occupational divisions: the Kapadia, who sell old and used garments; the Magnia, who subsist by begging; and the Chatnia, who beg and eat discarded food. All of them have low status.

Obstacles

The Baori do not trust outsiders. Because of their lifestyle, it may be difficult for Christian workers to have contact with these people.

Outreach Ideas

Christians need to feel genuine compassion and concern for these people and not be condescending. There may be opportunities to minister to their physical and material needs in order to establish trust. For example, Christians can teach them valuable business and computer skills.

Prayer Focus

Pray Baori Christian believers would be properly taught the truths of Scripture. Pray they would learn and practice the ways of Christ. Pray for
