

Bedia (Hindu traditions) in Nepal



One source considers Bedia to be the generic name of a number of vagrant, nomadic groups. Traditionally, a large section of the Bedia were reported to be earning a livelihood from prostitution and dancing, however, this has largely been discontinued. The Bedia worship deities like Thakur, Shiva, Parvati, Hanuman, Chamunda, Kali and Sitala and Kharmata (a local deity).

Ministry Obstacles

Giving up allegiance to personal deities may be threatening for any Hindu.

Outreach Ideas

It will take much prayer to soften the hearts of the Bedia people.
