

Kaikadi in India



The Kaikadi have a bad name and they were once called a criminal tribe. Their touch was once considered to be polluted, and they were barred from entering village temples. Consequently, they have a very low social status. Formerly nomadic, most have settled in the Indian states of Karnataka and Maharashtra. They follow their animistic religion, heavily influenced by Hinduism, and are locked into the caste hierarchy.

Obstacles

India has a secular constitution and grants freedom of religion, but there is strong Hindu opposition to the gospel message. Many Scripture resources are available in their language, including audio from Global Recordings Network.

Outreach Ideas

There is no substitute for a personal visit by someone who can spread the gospel message to individual Kaikadis. A Christian from another Indian group or someone from another country could visit them. The very brief GRN recording could be played by the visitor on his phone as an introduction.
