The Mewati people of Pakistan today follow Muslim practices and customs, but until partition in 1947 and the resulting resurgence of Islamic tradition, they mixed their beliefs with Hindu teachings. Though Pakistani society tries to eliminate caste because it has its roots in Hinduism, the practice still affects people in this Muslim country.

Ministry Obstacles

The Mewati people have a long history as Hindus, but their identity is in Islam. Muslim neighbors can intimidate any Mewati person who dares to look outside of Islam for spiritual answers.

Outreach Ideas

There are many oral and printed gospel materials in the Western Punjabi language that the Mewati can understand. Individuals can discreetly distribute gospel materials.

Prayer Focus

Pray that the Lord will soon raise up the first fellowship of Mewati Muslim background believers in Pakistan. Pray that believers worldwide will harness the tools of the internet and social media to reach the Mewati of
