



Qassab in Pakistan

The community name Qassab means "to cut" in Arabic. Also called Kasai, they are a professional Muslim caste of butchers. They sell meat and trade in hides, as well as clean cotton, and many now engage in business or work as daily-wage laborers. The Kasai people belong to the Sunni sect of Islam. The Kasai sacred specialist, the Qazi, performs worship and other rituals.

Ministry Obstacles

Spiritual opposition, opposition from men, dullness of hearts, and difficulties of access threaten the advance of the gospel in Pakistan.

Outreach Ideas

Literacy teachers equipped with Christian resources could express the Christian ideal of peace and love. These Muslims need Christ's messengers and a powerful revelation of the Lord. It is difficult, but perhaps medical personnel who follow the Lord can be Christ's ambassadors.

Prayer Focus

Current research suggests that few, if any, Christian believers exist amongst the Qassab. Pray that
