Ministry Obstacles

As Sikhs, the Ramdasias believe in reincarnation. They believe that their good deeds will be rewarded, their bad deeds punished, and they will be born again and again until they attain salvation. According to Sikhism, God cannot take on human form.

Outreach Ideas

Sikhism has several beliefs in common with Christianity. Sikhs believe in one God, the creator of the world, who does not die. They also have a form of baptism. Bridges of common understanding could lead to faith in Christ.

Prayer Focus

There has been no indication that there are followers of Jesus Christ among the Ramdasia people. Pray for any secret believers and for others to soon come to Christ. Pray
