

Rangrez (Muslim) in Bangladesh



Rangrez means dyer in Persian. Rangrez people traditionally dye cloth. They were originally Hindus worshiping many gods, but Muslim missionaries converted this people group to Islam many centuries ago. They maintain a low to middle caste status wherever they live in South Asia. Most Rangrez people live in India's northcentral states and Pakistan's Punjab Province, but some live in Bangladesh.

Ministry Obstacles

The Rangrez people in Bangladesh face tremendous social pressure to not turn to another belief system.

Outreach Ideas

Rangrez people live where there are very few followers of Lord Jesus Christ. They have contact only with other Muslims and some Hindus in Bangladesh. Christian businessmen could find a way to purchase Rangrez-made goods for the world market. This effort would give them regular contact with this spiritually needy Muslim community in Bangladesh. The entire Bible has been translated into Bengali, their spoken language. Audio and visual resources also exist for their benefit. Perhaps they can view the JESUS Film in homes and outreached areas.
