Sarki in Bhutan

igh in the Himalayas is the monarchy of Bhutan. Bhutan is Buddhist, but the Sarki are Hindus. While there are some Christians among the Bhutanese, there are none among the Sarkis. Why are Hindu Sarkis living among Buddhists? They do so because of community status; cobblers and leather-working Sarkis are stigmatized by Hindus. By living here, they avoid the stigma. In reality, however, the Sarkis need a new trade because shoemaking and repair are a dying trade. As Hindus, they continue to worship several gods. Shamans are important in Sarki society. Unfortunately, their women are often subjected to sex trafficking.

Obstacles

It will be difficult to locate the Sarki in order to reach them.

Outreach Ideas

The Sarkis need job training to compete outside of the shoemaking trade. They may be reached through Bengali and Bhutanese Christian tracts and radio. Christ followers who help the Sarkis stop the trafficking of their women would be excellent ambassadors for the Lord. Meanwhile, Christians may engage them as they need shoe repair.
