Kamboh (Sikh) in India



The Kamboh of Punjab probably came to India from Central Asia about three thousand years ago. Many Kamboh are landowners, and others are employed in various vocations. Sikhism, the religion of the Kamboh Sikhs, originated in the Punjab where most Kamboh reside. Sikhs believe in only one God, rejecting idol worship and the Hindu caste system. They teach giving to the less fortunate and serving others.

Ministry Obstacles

The Kamboh people are spread over most of India, with small contingents in Bangladesh and Pakistan. It will likely require many church planting efforts to effectively carry the gospel to the entire people group.

Outreach Ideas

Sikhism has some teachings in common with Christianity, such as worshiping one God and "keeping God in one's heart at all times." These teachings can be bridges to the teachings of Christ.

Prayer Focus

The Lord is moving in Punjab. There may be no Christians among the Kamboh people yet. Pray for Punjabi



speaking believers to take the gospel to the Kamboh people. Pray all Sikhs will hunger to know God in a personal, life changing way, and not be satisfied with a religious system. Pray for workers to be thrust out to these Sikh Punjabis.

PRAY for the Holy Spirit to give His armor to the believers among today's people group.
