If you ever buy anything made from ceramics in India, you will probably be buying from someone from the Kumhar community who can be either Hindu or Sikh. The Sikhs among them live primarily in Punjab, where there is a Sikh majority. Many still work in their traditional occupation of creating and producing pottery and ceramics. They are faithful to the Sikh code of conduct, established by the teaching of ten Sikh gurus. This includes recognizing that there is one divine light that is manifest in all things, mediating, reading or reciting daily prayers as written in their holy book known as the Guru Granth. Kumhars, like other Sikhs, are devoted to their spiritual way of life and community. The majority do not desire to change. They are resistant to Christians and Muslims as they believe they have the knowledge of the true light of god.
