

Guanyingqiao Jiarong in China



To outsiders, the Guanyingqiao people look like Tibetans. However, the language they speak is not closely related to Tibetan. The Guanyingqiao live in a remote mountainous area of northwestern Sichuan Province in China seldom visited by others. Like Tibetans, they practice Buddhism and shamanism. The Guanyingqiao raise animals and grow crops in the short summers of the high mountains.

Ministry Obstacles

There are limited roads to the region of Sichuan where the Guanyingqiao live. The Guanyingqiao have been Buddhists for centuries, and it is part of their core identity. By contrast, they see Christianity as a foreign religion opposed to their traditions and culture. There are no Christian resources available in the Guanyingqiao language of Lavrung.

Outreach Ideas

Han Chinese believers can go to the Guanyingqiao to set up businesses with them. The Han believers can help the Guanyingqiao with modern medicine and in setting up schools for their children.

Prayer Focus

Pray that Christian resources, including a complete Bible, would be
