



Keji in China

The Keji are Tibetan-speaking Sunni Muslims. They co-exist with another Muslim group, the ethnic Hui, which is recognized by the Chinese government. The Hui speak Chinese, while the Keji do not. The Keji were originally from Kashmir. They have their own mosques and restaurants, so they may eat ritually clean foods and avoid pork. Economically, they engage in commerce and trading. There are no known Christ followers among them.

Obstacles

Non-recognition by the Chinese government makes them invisible and unknown. Communist distrust of anything that sounds Christian is also an obstacle.

Outreach Ideas

Chinese churches should deliberately try to reach the Keji people for Christ. They will need to understand their cultural sensitivities and go to them as friends.

Prayer Focus

Pray that Chinese churches would evangelize them. Pray that soon there would be Keji disciples who will
