

Yutian Uyghur in China



The Yutian Uyghurs are known for being culturally distinct from other Uyghurs. Certain clothing and unique hairstyles separate them from the others. Previously, they were an independent kingdom called Jumi. As with most Turkic speaking groups in China, the Yutian Uyghurs are Sunni Muslim. The last groups of Christian Uyghurs were forcibly converted to Islam around 1390. Today, the Uyghur peoples are being persecuted by the Chinese government.

Ministry Obstacles

There are no known believers among the Uyghurs. They also have a history of forceful conversion, which may make them wary to new influences that could pose a threat.

Outreach Ideas

Outreach and prayer could help spread the gospel message to the Uyghurs. Only through goodwill can the word of Jesus spread.
