

Ganda in India



How would you like to be part of a people group whose name means “donkey?” The Ganda of India are a Dalit people, the lowest caste. Unlike some Dalits, however, the Ganda are mostly closed to the gospel. They are farmers who marry young and live in various parts of India including Chhattisgarh State. They speak Odia and Hindi, two of India’s major languages.

Ministry Obstacles

Ministry obstacles include the stigma of caste status, lack of education, devotion to Hindu gods, and little Christian witness.

Outreach ideas

The Bible and media tools are available in Odia and Hindi. Outreach ideas include Jesus comic book distribution, showing the JESUS Film, one-on-one evangelism with the Evangecube, and the wordless book. Believers can also take the gospel to them through skits, stories and songs.
