



Aringa in Uganda

The Aringa people are subsistence farmers who live primarily in northwestern Uganda, East Africa. They grow tobacco and cotton as cash crops. They also grow cassava, sweet potatoes, pumpkins, peanuts, sorghum, soybeans, and maize. After being driven out of Uganda during the Idi Amin Dada era, they have now returned to their homeland and live in relative safety.

Ministry Obstacles

The Aringa people are primarily Muslim though their practice of Islam is tainted by traditional religion. They do not know or acknowledge that Jesus is the only way to salvation.

Outreach Ideas

There are many Christian materials available in the language of the Aringa. The Bible was made available in their language in 2014. They also have the JESUS Film and Global Recordings in their language.

Prayer Focus

The Aringa people are still considered unreached. However, there are now a growing number of Christ followers. Pray for these believers to be filled with the power and the fruit of the
