

Angku in China



The Angku are classed by the Chinese government as the same as the Bulong people. The Angku people predate the Han Chinese. They practice Theravada Buddhism, which is central to their life. It is based on Buddhist scriptures and teaches that each person must work out his or her own salvation. Like most people in this region, they blend Buddhism with ancient religious practices. They live in Yunnan Province, China's most unreached region.

Ministry Obstacles

Their small numbers, remoteness and a lack of interest on the part of Chinese Christians are the major obstacles to reaching them with the gospel. There are no Christian resources available in the Angku language, although the Bible is available in Mandarin. Unfortunately, local believers from a tribal background have not reached the Angku people.

Outreach Ideas

Chinese Christians need to deliberately reach out to these Theravada Buddhists.

Prayer Focus

Some tribes in Yunnan have the gospel. Pray for Christian believers
