



Baharlu in Iran

The Baharlu are a nomadic group who only live in Iran. They are known for their beautiful weavings and rugs, which are desired by many and fetch a high price. Similar to most nomads in Central Asia, the Baharlu livelihood is tied directly to their livestock. They speak a Turkic language, closely related to Southern Azerbaijani. It is similar to the languages spoken by many other tribes in the area. These languages are from a different linguistic branch than Farsi, the trade language of Iran.

Obstacles

The Baharlu are primarily Muslim and have not heard of the ways of Jesus. It is very difficult to reach them with the gospel as they live in a closed country.

Outreach Ideas

Making biblical resources more available in their language would be very helpful for outreach to the Baharlu. Prayer is also a way that outsiders may help reach them for the Savior.
