Oswal Bania in India



he Oswal Bania live in northern India, where they are usually well-to-do businessmen. They are Jains, who are vegetarians because they abhor killing animals, even as a sacrifice to a deity. Jainism is a philosophy. They believe in gods, but not God. Like Hindus and Buddhists, Jains believe in the spiritual law of karma, but see it as a tangible substance and a spiritual force. As a group, they lack any Christian witness, largely because there are very few Christian disciples from India's prestigious communities.

Ministry Obstacles

Most evangelism in India focuses attention on people from underprivileged communities, not Jains. Furthermore, Christian meat-eating is an obstacle as Jains find it abhorrent and unspiritual. Thus, possibly only vegetarians will effectively evangelize Jains. The Eucharist is an obstacle because Jesus said that it was his body and blood. This can easily be misunderstood.

Outreach Ideas

Radio, TV, print and other media should have special materials for Jains in their languages. These will need to address their unique concerns.
