

Mbojo in Indonesia



The Mbojo are also called the Oma ("move") because they often move from one place to another. The Bima language, sometimes called Nggahi Mbojo, has several dialects. The main livelihood of the Mbojo is farming in fields, but they also plant rice in paddies using a special irrigation system called panggawa. They are well-known horse tenders as well. Bima women are usually skilled at making plaited mats from bamboo and palm leaves.

Ministry Obstacles

The Mbojo people live in an underserved island that rarely attracts attention. They are Muslim, and few are willing to challenge their ancient beliefs.

Outreach Ideas

The Mbojo people are afraid of spirits. Christ followers who understand spiritual warfare can go to them and demonstrate God's power over malevolent spirits.

Prayer Focus

Pray for the Mbojo people to accept the Lord as their rock and their fortress. He alone can protect them.
