



Akkin in Russia

The Akkin people live in village clusters at the western edge of Dagestan, outside the major city of Khasavyurt. In 1944, the Akkin were deported to Central Asia by Stalin's regime. Modern Akkin history is filled with turmoil and conflict, as resettlement questions caused tensions among several Dagestani people groups. Akkin refugees live throughout Europe, along with Chechen, Ingush and other Dagestani refugees. The Akkin practice Sufi Islam, but Wahhabi radicals have attempted to prevent Sufi practices throughout Dagestan.

Ministry Obstacles

The Akkin are devout and committed Muslims. This makes it more difficult for them to understand and accept the centrality of Jesus Christ as essential truth.

Outreach Ideas

There are pockets of Akkin living throughout Europe, where the gospel is more accessible. Christian missionaries can reach out to the Akkin in Europe.
