Doma in Zimbabwe



The Doma are hunter gatherers who live in Zimbabwe's mountains and lowlands. They are the only non-agricultural people of Zimbabwe. The Doma speak Shona and Dema. They are largely preliterate and have little or no access to schools and hospitals.

Ministry Obstacles

The Doma have little contact with other Zimbabweans and this has made it difficult for the missionaries to reach them. They follow their ethnic religion which has enslaved them to the spirit world. A few of them also practice Islam and are not open to the gospel.

Outreach ideas

There is a great need for healthcare and educational opportunities for the tribe, which might help introduce them to the life-giving Savior. The Government's efforts to integrate them with the mainline Zimbabweans also might expose them to the Christian world granting them access to Bibles and churches.

Prayer Focus

Pray that the local churches in the area show the love and kindness of
